

I-252 | Frequently Asked Questions



Q. What is I-252?

I-252 is a small-group focused Sunday morning environment for children (K-5th grade). We inspire kids to live it out by reminding them to make the wise choice, trust God no matter what, and treat others the way you want to be treated. Each month we focus on one of God's Big Ideas that teach those three truths.

Q. What is a typical Sunday like in I-252?

The morning begins with small and large group volunteers arriving 1 hour before I-252 opens. When students arrive, the small group leaders do interactive activities with them. Then I-252 begins with a large group experience where the week's bottom line and Bible story are revealed. Finally, the morning ends with the students discussing the bottom line with their small group leaders.

Q. Where is there an opportunity for me to serve?

You can serve as a small group leader on Sundays. You can join our cast as an actor, singer, or host for our weekly large group experience. You can even participate as a resource or curriculum coordinator during the week.

Q. How often would I serve?

It varies based on the position. Small group leaders (SGLs) commit to lead the same group of preschoolers every Sunday (yes, you can take a weekend off when you need to!). As a SGL you and a partner will serve at one service each Sunday which then enables you to attend the other. As a part of our large group cast you would serve at one service each Sunday which then enables you to attend the other. As a curriculum or resource coordinator, the time you serve is more flexible.

Q. What is a Small Group Leader? What age group would I lead?

A Small Group Leader invests in a loving relationship with every child, makes an effort to build a bridge to the family, and celebrates their spiritual growth. Our small groups are divided into K-2nd grades and 3rd-5th grades. These groups typically have no more than 6 children in them.

Q. What is the large group experience? What are the roles for the cast?

The large group environment is designed to make the Bible come to life by using costumes, props, or characters from the story to unveil the bottom line. The roles for the Large Group environment include a producer, host, storyteller, vocalist, and computer operator.

Q. What is a Resource Coordinator?

A Resource Coordinator is responsible for seeing that the Small Group Leaders and the Large Group Team have all of the resources and supplies needed on a weekly basis. This coordinator may delegate parts of this task to other individuals on their team.

Q. What is a Curriculum Coordinator?

A Curriculum Coordinator is responsible for seeing that the Small Group Leaders and the Large Group Team have the curriculum needed on a weekly basis. This involves the printing of all curriculum and activity sheets, sorting by small groups, and placing all materials in the designated central location.
