

Q. What is Ignite?

Ignite is our middle and high school environment that currently meets one Sunday night a month. Our goal is to create a student ministry that unchurched teenagers love to attend and develop in students a lifelong passion for Jesus.

Q. What is a typical Ignite service like?

It's a blast! It's a mix between a large group environment (games, music from the band, short message that centers on a biblical truth) and a small group environment where students and their Small Group Leaders hang out and talk about the message and things going on in their lives.

Q. Where is there an opportunity for me to serve?

You can serve as a Small Group Leader (SGL) for a group of students of your choice. You can serve on the Street Team as a greeter or checking in students as they register. You can serve on the Food Crew setting up, organizing, or serving refreshments. You can even serve on Road Crew helping set up or tear down all the equipment needed for each Ignite event. During the school year you can serve as an in-school volunteer tutoring students in the classroom.

Q. What is the role of a Small Group Leader?

The role of a SGL is to build relationships and start conversations with their group of students.

Q. What age group would I lead as a Small Group Leader?

Ladies can lead a small group of middle school girls or high school girls. Guys can lead a small group of middle school boys or high school boys. Each group consists of ten or fewer students and two or more leaders.

Q. What is the role of the Street Team?

The role of the Street Team is to welcome and inform. The Street Team is the face of Ignite, the first encounter students have with our team. Greeters and Check-in volunteers make a huge impression on students by sparking a conversation and making sure they know where to go.

Q. What is the role of the Food Crew?

The role of the Food Crew is to create an awesome food experience. Food Crew helps students to relax, feel comfortable, and have an excellent overall experience.

Q. What is the role of the Road Crew?

The role of Road Crew volunteers is to set-up and tear down everything necessary for production to begin on time. Without Road Crew it would be impossible to create an environment where students can develop a lifelong passion for Jesus.

Q. What is the role of In-School Volunteers?

The role of in-school volunteers is to build relationships and tutor students. In-school volunteers are very important because spending time on student turf paves the way to influence and acceptance with students.

Q. How often would I serve?

It varies based on the position. Small Group Leaders (SGLs) commit to lead the same group of students at every Ignite for four years alongside another small group leader. Street Team and Food Crew volunteers commit to serve an hour before Ignite, during the event, and stay until all the students have been picked up by their parents. Road Crew volunteers commit to serve on each Ignite Sunday from 3:00-4:30pm or 7:30-8:30pm. In-School volunteers typically serve one hour each week in the classroom.
