

Road Crew | Frequently Asked Questions

Q. What is Road Crew?

Road Crew is the indispensable team that sets up and tears down all of the staging and equipment used in our physical environments every week so that people can have an unbelievable, unforgettable worship experience!

Q. What is a typical Sunday like with Road Crew?

Road Crew volunteers typically serve for approximately one hour each Sunday. Road Crew is comprised of a Set Up team and a Tear Down team. The Set Up team arrives beginning at 7 AM and unloads the trailer bringing all equipment to the third floor. This team also sets up all staging, outdoor signage, and chairs as well as assisting Production Team with audio/visual equipment. This team typically completes its work by 8 AM.

Additional Set Up team members arrive at 7:30 AM to assemble and place screens, backdrops, and drapery. They then empty the children's rooms of tables and chairs. This team typically completes their work by 8:15 AM. The Tear Down team stays after the 11 AM service to break down and pack away all equipment and staging. They are responsible to load all equipment into our trailer and are finished between 1:15-1:30 PM.

Q. What do volunteers do on Road Crew?

There are a variety of responsibilities with which you can help including working with staging, loading or unloading the trailer, setting up chairs for the worship service, running cables, moving equipment, and more!

Q. Is this a team for males only?

Absolutely not! We have some incredible females who serve on Road Crew and opportunities for anyone who wants to be a part.

Q. How often would I serve?

Road Crew volunteers serve every week on their select team. Yes, you can take a weekend off when you want to!
